Drought assistance announced

The Minister for Primary Industries Katrina Hodgkinson announced an expansion of drought support measures to a number of drought affected regions across NSW. This includes the following Local Government Areas:

Armidale, Bogan, Central Darling, Cobar, Coonamble, Gilgandra, Glen Innes, Gunnedah, Guyra, Gwydir, Inverell, Moree Plains, Narrabri, Tamworth Regional, Tenterfield, Uralla, Walcha, Warren, Warrumbungle, Broken Hill, Unincorporated Area.

The NSW Government has committed \$7 million to drought support measures which include: Up to \$20,000 per producer in the form of a transport subsidy for the transport of stock to

- sale, slaughter or agistment, fodder for stock, drinking water for stock and domestic water.
- Up to \$30,000 per producer is available for the installation of water infrastructure for livestock.
- The waiving of Local Land Services rates, Western Lands Lease payments and Wild Dog **Destruction Board fees.**

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Cheesy Cauliflower Pancakes are low carb, super tasty, and perfect for lunch or a side dish. Ingredients •1 head cauliflower (or a 16 oz bag of frozen cauliflower) •2 large eggs • $\frac{1}{2}$ -3/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese (I love cheese, so use closer to $\frac{3}{4}$ cup) • $\frac{1}{4}$ cup diced green onions • $\frac{1}{2}$ -1 cup bread crumbs (I usually need closer to 1 cup) • $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp cayenne pepper (more or less to taste) •salt •olive oil •light sour cream (optional) Instructions 1.Cut cauliflower into florets and cook in boiling water until tender, about 10 minutes 2.Drain and mash the cauliflower while it is still warm 3.Stir cheese, eggs, green onions, bread crumbs, cayenne & salt to taste

4.Coat the bottom of a skillet with olive oil over medium-high heat 5.Form the cauliflower mixture into patties about 3 inches across 6.Cook until golden brown & set, about 3 minutes per side 7.Enjoy with some light sour cream!

This could relate to several areas such as business, work within schools or community centres, campaigning for protection of wildlife or development of rural industry, sport and fitness advocates, pursuit for knowledge in senior years and development of education programs.

Mr Marshall said that he was keen to celebrate the vital and important role seniors played in the community and believed it important to give thanks where it is due.

Nominations close at 5pm on Monday, 3 March 2014 and forms can be collected from council administration centres in Tenterfield, Glen Innes, Inverell, Warialda, Bingara, Walcha, Uralla, Guyra and in Armidale at Kent House Community Centre or the office of the Member for Northern Tablelands at 175 Rusden Street.

The awards will be presented by Mr Marshall during 2014 NSW Seniors Week which is being held between 15-23 March 2014.


